 4. Answer the following questions:
 - a. Do you think Ricardo is a Cyberbully? Why or why not?
 - b. What does Ricardo mean when he says that information “gets around really quick”?
 - c. Ricardo thinks that harassing others on the Internet, rather than in person, appeals to some teenagers because they can’t be attacked back physically. What do you think?
 - d. Have you ever encountered online cruelty?
 - e. How do you think someone might feel after being the target of online cruelty?
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5. Create a new page on your website titled “Digital Citizenship: Cyberbullying and Online Cruelty – Stacey’s Story”
 6. Watch the video “**Stacey’s Story: When Rumors Escalate**” (link is found on the class website under Assignments – Digital Citizenship tab)
 7. Write a brief summary of the video.
 8. Answer the following questions:
 - a. Who was involved in the story and what roles did they play?
 - b. Who was the target?
 - c. Who were the offenders?
 - d. Where were there bystanders and/or Upstanders?
 - e. How do you think the online cruelty might be different from offline behavior?
 - f. What do you think you might have done if you were Stacey?
 - g. What could you have done if you wanted to be an Upstander in this situation?
 - h. Have you or a friend ever experienced a situation similar to Stacey’s?
 - i. How might the strategies in the notes have helped you in that situation?
